This term, we have been busy learning a lot of different things. To consolidate our learning, we have made artworks as a way to show our understanding. One of the things we learnt about in Maths was surface area. We understood how surfaces can be covered by different shapes and patterns, like tiles. This is called tessellation; we designed our own patterns to make a whole class artwork.
















Library News New Books! New Books!
